2021 IN REVIEW

Although we did not anticipate still being in a pandemic in 2021, we were fortunate enough to remain able to safely provide shelter and housing services to families and children in need. Throughout 2021, our priority was ensuring the health and safety of all of our guests, staff, and community partners. St. Francis House maintained COVID safety protocols for our overnight shelter guests and continued to safely provide meals and case management services to our outside clients. While we all hope that these times of uncertainty are almost over, we know that with your support we will continue to be able to provide the necessary services needed for the homeless in our community.

Our 2021 Reasons for Gratitude

- 🏠 We assisted a total of 1,071 people
- 🏠 934 adults received case management services
- 🏠 98 families and 137 children were housed
- 🏠 60 families received help through our Home, Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing Programs
- 🏠 95% remain in permanent housing today
- 🏠 Overall community support increased by 34.5% and individual donations increased by 27%
- 🏠 Foundation and trust contributions increased by 125%
- 🏠 *The Amazing Give* – On April 22, we participated in the Amazing Give, and in less than a day, we raised over \$30,000!
- 🏠 *GACAR's Annual Fundraiser* – We were honored to be chosen as Gainesville-Alachua Association of Realtors' (GACAR) annual charity for their fundraising event in 2021. Over \$17,000 was raised through this fun bowling event that helped renovate and update the playgrounds at St. Francis House & Arbor House. Thank you to everyone at GACAR!
- 🏠 *Rock Paper Scissors Tournament* – In October, we had the opportunity to hold our Rock Paper Scissors Fundraising Tournament at First Magnitude Brewing Company. Our 2021 COVID New Initiatives


- 🏠 Home & Prevention Programs – for families who are at the risk of losing their housing

While 2021 brought more new changes to St. Francis House than we expected, we are forever thankful for you and your support. The flexibility and understanding shown by the community have been overwhelming.




HOMELESSNESS IN OUR COMMUNITY










COMMUNITY IMPACT



DID YOU KNOW?

Families with children are the fastest-growing segment of the homeless population; and also, one of the hardest groups of people to see, let alone count. Though the US Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) conducts an annual Point-in-Time count of the homeless, including homeless families, its methodology has been criticized for under-reporting the number of homeless families, since homeless families do not readily admit that they are experiencing homelessness due to fear of judgment and losing their children.

Families who stayed at St. Francis House moved into permanent housing within:

Jasmine came into our shelter after being in an abusive relationship. I was so amazed by her courage and eagerness to change. The first day we set down to implement a case plan, she was willing to get out and tackle each goal without hesitation. Jasmine came in without employment and obtained a full-time job within her first two weeks of staying at St. Francis House. Because of her hard work and dedication, she achieved permanent and stable housing within 30 days.


