

Lisa and her granddaughter, Mandy, found themselves at St. Francis House during a challenging period. They had no other place to turn, especially after Lisa recently ended a 37-year marriage. Lisa, facing the additional obstacle of near-blindness, recognized the importance of securing stable housing before undergoing the necessary surgery to address her vision issues. Collaborating closely with our dedicated case managers, Lisa exerted tremendous effort to identify a residence that would meet their specific needs. The compassionate staff at St. Francis House supported Lisa and Mandy throughout this challenging period. We are delighted to announce that Lisa and Mandy have successfully transitioned into their new home, marking a significant and positive turn in their lives. The entire St. Francis House team is honored to have been part of this transformative journey. We are excited about the promising future that lies ahead for Lisa and Mandy.

Veronica, a resilient 74-year-old female veteran, sought refuge at our shelter after undergoing a challenging two-month hospital stay for a hip replacement. Discharged and faced with the unsettling reality of homelessness, Veronica turned to St. Francis House for support. Throughout her stay, she not only prioritized her recovery but also became a beacon of inspiration for fellow residents, showcasing an unwavering positive spirit. Our case managers worked with Veronica to secure specialized assistance and counseling services tailored to her situation. The collaborative efforts paid off. We are delighted to announce that Veronica has successfully secured an affordable living arrangement that meets her accessibility requirements and ensure a smooth transition from St. Francis House to her new home.
