







- An estimated 186,084 people in families, or 57,563 households, experienced homelessness on a single night
- Adults and children in families make up more than 37% of the total homeless population

# **SUCCESS STORY**



When Sarah, a determined and hardworking young single mother, arrived at St. Francis House in the summer, she was facing one of the most challenging times of her life. Pregnant with her second child and accompanied by her 2-year-old daughter, Emma, Sarah had been working full-time but was still unable to make ends meet. She was overwhelmed with anxiety about how she would provide for her growing family and desperately needed a place to turn for help.

Sarah's journey to St. Francis House began after months of searching tirelessly for a second job or higher-paying work. Despite her dedication and persistence, she was unable to secure the additional income needed to cover her family's basic needs. With her savings depleted and nowhere else to turn, Sarah arrived at St. Francis House feeling hopeless and vulnerable but also determined to find a way to create a better future for her children.

After meeting with the compassionate staff at St. Francis House, Sarah was introduced to the Arbor House program, which provides safe, supportive housing for mothers like her. She and Emma were welcomed into a warm and nurturing environment where they no longer had to worry about the uncertainty of where they would sleep or how they would get through the next day.

At Arbor House, Sarah gained access to individualized case management, community resources, and referrals tailored to her needs. She also benefited from affordable rent, which gave her the financial breathing room to focus on her goals. With the help of St. Francis House, Sarah received not just shelter but also the stability and encouragement she needed to regain her confidence and move forward. One of the most significant ways the community rallied around Sarah was by helping her prepare for the arrival of her baby. Thanks to generous donations, she was able to gather essential items, such as baby clothes, diapers, a crib, and supplies for her newborn.

In October, Sarah welcomed her beautiful baby boy, James, into the world. Born healthy at 6 pounds 5 ounces, James was a source of immense joy for Sarah and Emma, who was thrilled to become a big sister. This milestone marked a new chapter for the family, one filled with hope and renewed determination. Not long after James was born, Sarah's hard work paid off when she secured a better-paying job that allowed her to provide more effectively for her family. The stability of her new income, combined with the support from St. Francis House, gave Sarah the opportunity to start planning for her family's next step: moving into a new home.

Today, Sarah, Emma, and James are thriving. Sarah is excited to provide her children with a safe and stable environment where they can grow and flourish. She often reflects on how far they've come, filled with gratitude for the support, compassion, and encouragement she received at St. Francis House. Sarah's story is a testament to the power of community and the life-changing impact of programs like Arbor House. It's a reminder that with the right resources and a network of people who care, even the most daunting challenges can be overcome.
